# 2010 Population - Regions

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#### New Mexico Regions 2010 Census Population At-a-Glance

Data from the 2010 Decennial Census includes population information for many levels of geography in New Mexico, including counties. The counts show the population as of April 1, 2010. Research & Polling, Inc. grouped the counties into five regions and examined changes from 2000 to 2010, as well as compared the growth from 1990 to 2000 to the growth from 2000 to 2010.

A number of observations can be made.

- The fastest growing region from 2000 to 2010 was the Albuquerque Metro area, which is the only one to increase by more than 20%. In comparison, from 1990 to 2000 four regions grew by more than 20%, with the Southwest region growing at a higher rate than the rest.
- The Albuquerque Metro region is the only one of the five that came close to its growth rate from 1990 to 2000 (21.7% versus 21.6%, respectively). The other four regions all saw significantly slower growth rates from 2000 to 2010 than from 1990 to 2000.
- New Mexico's four largest cities (Albuquerque, Las Cruces, Rio Rancho and Santa Fe) are growing at a much faster rate compared to the rural areas in their respective regions.
- Without the 11.5% growth in Santa Fe County, the North Central region would have remained unchanged from 2000 to 2010.
- Without the 19.8% growth in Doña Ana County, the Southwest region would have actually lost population.
- In the East region, the four least populous counties had the four largest negative growth rates (De Baca, Harding, Quay and Union counties).
